Partnership News from Mrs Westall

I have written an impact document, outlining some of the benefits of partnership working. Here is an extract. Further extracts will follow:

Impact of partnership model on the children

The children at both schools have been given memorable experiences:

- Year 3 have visited Mousehold to attend a Maths afternoon, working with all ages from Nursery to Year 2. The Year 3 children enjoyed coming back to Mousehold and were excited and could articulate their favourite moments when there last year. The younger children looked up to the Year 3s and were helped by them with their Maths learning.
- Year 2 children have visited GWJS Year 3 children for a Maths afternoon and this supported with transition for the children who will be starting there in Sept 2022.
- Year 6 children watched the Year 2 Samba Drumming performance. They remembered learning Samba when at Mousehold and could talk about how their learning in music since then has built upon the foundations of music at Mousehold.
- Joint working for Refugee Week. There will be displays ion both schools to share the work the children have completed from Nursery to Year 6 to show respect and understanding of refugees in our schools and their families. This links to the 'Respect' ethos at GWJS and the 'High Five' at Mousehold.
- The progression of learning is clear from Nursery to Year 6, and subject leaders have worked together on this. This means that children's learning builds upon previous learning and this gives the children the best chance to learn more and remember more, leading to better outcomes at the end of Year 6.

Year 3 has settled really well at George White. We have been learning about place value in Maths. In English we are learning to write a story based on Little Red Reading Hood. The children have been

excited to learn French and about where we are in the world in Geography. Well done Year 3 on a very successful week.

Year 4 We are really impressed with how the year 4 children have settled into their new classes, we have been introducing our new topics for geography, science and RE. In art, the children preserved to create a self-portrait using the prior skills they learnt in year 3.

Year 5 This week we have had a busy week. The children have settled in well and worked hard. In our maths work, we have been learning all about Roman numerals up to 1000. In English we have begun writing based on The Whale by Ethan and Vita Murrow. In our foundation subjects, we have begun to learn about Ancient Greeks in History and states of matter in Science.

Year 6 have made a fantastic start. They are setting a splendid example to the rest of the school showing great behaviour and following the respect ethos. They have been setting up experiments with prisms and mirrors to show how light travels in straight lines and learning about the exodus of people from the Caribbean on the Windrush boat in the 1940s. All children in Year 6 have a diary now to record key dates and homework activities.
