OUR LEARNING THIS WEEK

YEAR 3

In English this week we have started using effective metaphors, adjectives and adverbs in our letter writing. We are gaining confidence in using prefixes and suffixes. Because our text is based on the story of a young girl creating a garden; we have spent time planting a variety of seeds. We have

decided to run a garden centre in the first week after half term. More information to follow! In Maths we have learnt to convert, add and subtract pounds and pence. We have had to pay for sweets and played some intensely competitive money based games.

In Science we found out about pollination. We went outside for a wild pollination race where we were bees. Then, thanks to Ms. Boutell, we have made stop motion animations of the process. In Geography we have found out about topographical maps. We made the most enormous maps showing the mountain ranges of the UK.

In Art we have created clay models of the animals we sketched last week. They look fantastic and we are so excited to paint them next week.

YEAR 5



Blake Class

Blake class have been looking at spelling of tricky words this week. We have all been on a tricky word walk to see how many of the first hundred high frequency words we know by sight and each time we do the loop, we try to get further.

We have also been using thesauruses in English to find synonyms for common words. We looked at words we will use for our space descriptions such as bright, big and dark and found other words which mean the same or similar. This way, each of our descriptive sentences will be different. Using a dictionary or thesaurus is a useful skill to practise too.

To improve our fine motor skills, we have been using peg boards and have been creating patterns trying to use our non-dominant hand, It takes much more concentration and muscle control and we are sure we can feel our brains working harder! We also challenged our partners to recreate our patterns to test our memory skills.

In maths, we have been learning how to subitise, the process of being able to spot (or estimate) amounts without counting each item. This will make addition and subtraction faster as we will be able to use our fingers more efficiently or even count in groups.
