# OUR LEARNING THIS WEEK

#### YEAR 3

This week in History we have had an afternoon of being Palaeolithic people. We made paints out of charcoal, leaves and roots and created cave paintings. We also tried to make tools out of stone, built mini shelters and tried to create a system for drying 'animal skins' (felt!). It was fun and we realised that it was very, very, very challenging being a Stone Age person! In Science we learned that our skeletons protect our organs. We represented our organs with eggs and had to create a skeleton that would protect them. We then dropped our skeletons to see if they were effective protection for our brain / heart / lungs. Some of the children set up an impromptu hospital for those whose organs were damaged in the fall...

In English we are continuing to focus on verbs. We are writing sentences in the past, present and future.

In Maths we have been partitioning numbers to 1000 and are now working on recognising the place value of numbers to 1000.









#### YEAR 4

We have had another busy week in year 4! On Monday in Maths the children had their first lesson on Roman numerals! We had fun exploring matching numbers to Roman numerals, the children worked so well in teams to help each other out. In English, the children have been looking at modal, regular and irregular verbs, we did a spot the verb activity on Wednesday. In Science children are continuing to learn about electricity, the children identified complete and incomplete circuits by building a circuit using different components. In History we are continuing to learn about the Roman Empire and the important figures in this time. In Art we are continuing to learn about Manga drawings, we are using the Poem I am a Roman Solider to complete a comic strip. In RSHE the children have been learning about The Rights of the Child and Democracy. This created some interesting and thoughtful discussions. We are all looking forward to our Roman Day next week!







#### YEAR 5

Another incredible week has flown past in year 5! Our maths work this week has again focused on place value, with numbers up to at least a million. We focused on ordering numbers, comparing them using < or > and exploring powers of ten, making numbers 10, 100 and 1,000 times bigger or smaller. We've been practising on TT Rockstars to keep up with our times tables learning.

We started a new reading text - a non-chronological report about teeth and have been learning the specific vocabulary and practising reading the text in different ways, including speed and echo reading. Other English work continued our grammar focus on single clause sentences, especially their punctuation, and we have explored using conjunctions to create multi-clause sentences.

Additionally, we have investigated the effect of gravity in our science lesson, learnt about life in Britannia after the fall of the Roman Empire, continued to work in our swimming skills, created abstract artwork using typography and focused on improving our understanding of race, how we value and appreciate diversity and individuality for everyone and the importance of empathy.



#### YEAR 6

Hello year 6 families!

It's been an amazing week in year 6! We've learned so much!

In PE we dove into football and dance. In dance we were the music by clapping our hands and stamping our feet. We created fun and amazing dance routines.

In Science we discussed about our circulatory system, learning how we can keep our hearts healthy.

In Art, we used the grid method to create larger drawings that we will transform into sculptures. In History, we had very interesting debates about "Why is prison a punishment?".

#### **Blake Class**

Blake class have continued with the topic of growing this week and have been setting up lots of experiments! We are growing bean and pea seeds on paper towels so we can see what happens when they start to sprout. Children are also growing their own sunflowers from seeds. To explore how stems transport water around a plant, we have put white flowers into water mixed with blue food colouring and are checking them every day to look for changes. Some of the petals are already turning blue!

In English, we have started exploring a variety of adjectives and prepositions to use in our sentence work when describing a setting. Children have been finding synonyms for common words such as 'big' and 'nice' and are using these to improve their writing. We make sure we say sentences out loud before writing them down so we know they make sense.

Children have shown great confidence (one of our school values) in many ways this week. Some of them went to choir for the first time with people they did not know, some demonstrated actions for a song and one brought her baton in and taught the other children some twirling techniques. It has been lovely to see them all developing their confidence.







# **Attendance**


We hold a celebration assembly every Friday morning to share and celebrate the children's achievements. During this Assembly , we also recognise the class with the highest overall attendance for the week.
